HEFOR09 Appeal Against Exclusion from Course

PURPOSE

Students who wish to appeal a decision to exclude a student from their course of study - made in accordance with the rules for course progression outlined in HEPP29 Student Progress and Exclusion Policy and Procedure - may complete this form and deliver it to the Student Welfare Officer, who will lodge it with the Academic Director for consideration.

REQUIREMENTS

REQUIREMENT TO ATTAIN MINIMUM ACADEMIC STANDARDS

Students are required to attain minimum academic standards. Students do not meet minimum academic standards in a course if they:

- fail a particular unit of study more than once; or
- fail 50% or more of the units of study attempted in a semester.

Additionally, international students are expected to complete their course in the requisite number of semesters for a student undertaking a full-time load (the approved course duration).

The Course Coordinator will monitor the progress of international students at the end of each semester to determine if satisfactory progress is being achieved.

STUDENTS WHO CONTINUE TO FAIL TO MEET MINIMUM ACADEMIC STANDARDS

If a student continues to fail to meet minimum academic standards after additional support has been provided, Student Administration will issue a notice of Unsatisfactory Academic Progress, in which you will be informed of the intention to exclude you from your course, in line with the *HEPP29 Student Progress and Exclusion Policy and Procedure*.

The form on the following pages must be completed in order for you to appeal against this decision to exclude you from the course.

APPEAL ON COMPASSIONATE GROUNDS

Compassionate circumstances are those that are beyond the student's ability to control and may have had a negative impact on the student's ability to maintain satisfactory academic progress.

These could include (but are not limited to):

- Serious illness or injury, where a medical certificate states the student was unable to attend class or to effectively study
- Bereavement due to loss of a close family member (copy of a death certificate may be required)
- Documented psychological condition for example: severe anxiety or depression
- A traumatic experience which could include (but is not limited to):
 - o Involvement in, or witness to, a serious accident or crime
 - A major political upheaval, or natural disaster, in the student's home country, requiring emergency travel which has impacted on study

Whatever the circumstances cited in the appeal against exclusion from course, sufficient evidence of the claims must be attached to this form at the time of submission.

RECORD KEEPING AND CONFIDENTIALITY

All records relating to student appeals will be treated as confidential and will be kept in a secure environment in accordance with SCEI (Higher Education)'s Records Management and Privacy policies.
